## How will your grades be awarded this summer?





- 1. The school will assess students against a national standard, which will be defined by the exam boards before the Easter break.
- 2. Our school results will be **quality assured externally** by the exam boards, which may include random sampling of our evidence.
- 3. If the exam boards are confident in our submitted results, then the exam boards will award students their final grades.
- 4. If students do not think their results are accurate, they will have the right to appeal.







- 1. An unfolding picture- we will continue to share information when we have it.
- 2. You have *every* chance of success in *every* assessment.
- 3. An evidence base must support a grade.
- 4. Exam boards will provide schools with detailed guidance on how to make grade judgments by the end of the spring term and will also publish "optional" assessment materials by Easter.
- 5. Teachers can use a "range of evidence", including mock exam results, coursework, or other work completed as part of a pupil's course, 'such as essays or in-class tests' to arrive at their judgments.
- 6. Assurance that grades will be awarded 'fairly and consistently' and there is a rigorous and robust process.

- 3. The agreed leaving date for Y11/13








- 1. Full engagement in all learning!
