

Mocks, tests and work already done can be used as evidence



Non-exam assessment should continue



Non-exam assessments can be used as evidence even if incomplete



Art & design grade based only on your portfolio



Teachers can use question banks provided by exam boards if they want to



Results will be based on completed and future work, so keep doing your best

Key things to remember:



1. The next 6 days will be focussed on high-quality, teaching, revision & learning in preparation for the assessment window that opens on Tuesday 4th May.
2. Y11 have no more than 2 written assessments per day.
3. Assessments have been shortened / chunked to support you.
4. Each subject has identified any gaps in assessment of AOs or content covered so that you are not assessed on information you haven't been taught.
5. Each subject has identified what to include in their **basket of evidence and we will share this with students and parents (control the controllables)**.
6. You will only complete assessments in the lessons labelled as assessment lessons.
7. You will continue normal lessons when not in assessments.
8. Once you have completed all assessments in a subject, you will be able to complete private revision (20-20-20)



What is a basket of evidence?

1. Students need **every** chance of success in **every** assessment. It is expected that student performance at the end of the course i.e in the assessments to be undertaken in Term 5 (and the NEA), will be the strongest performance for most students.
2. An evidence base must support a grade. One assessment may show 'potential' but it is a combination of evidence. No single piece of evidence will necessarily be more important than another and we will use a range of evidence that can give an overall picture of performance.
3. Assurance that grades will be awarded 'fairly and consistently' and there is a rigorous and robust process.



Special Consideration



Given that special consideration requests will not apply this summer, subject teachers will take into account where illness or other personal circumstances might have temporarily affected performance.

It is important that any such instances are raised before Hele's School submits the final grades.. In the meantime,
