- 3) A game (PPT). Once you have had a good look at the first two documents, you can have a go at this. I normally play this in class with my Y13 when we revise the sources. You are given 5 clues and you must guess the name of a source or of a medieval author. There are 10 sources/authors to guess. Don't worry about counting points! Just emailed me your guesses and I will tell you which ones you guessed right. Once again, the idea is to help you get more familiar with the sources.

Finally (and this is optional), I would recommend that at some point you get yourself a copy of Marc Morris' "The Norman Conquest". I always ask my Y12 to read it so if you want to get ahead, you could have a go at reading it and maybe produce a brief summary of each chapter. If you find it too dense however, don't worry and leave it aside for the moment.
