Dear Parent/Carer,

It is hard to believe that our students have now been learning remotely for six weeks. Your support of your child(ren) and the school throughout this term has been nothing short of remarkable – thank you!

School reopening plans: we know the Government indicated that schools nationally will continue to be closed to all children, with the exception of those who are eligible to attend as per the current arrangement, until at least Monday 8 March 2021. Current arrangement for providing vouchers to children eligible for free school meals will continue after the half-term holiday, until Friday 5 March.

We are expecting the government to release plans for school reopening on Monday 22 February, following the half term break, but we have no idea what these plans will look like, whether they will be different for Primary and Secondary schools, for different year groups, or for different parts of the country depending on the 'r' rate. We will be in touch as soon as we are able to following any announcement regarding schools being able to re-open, but please be patient as we work through the parameters of any return and plan the logistics. In the meantime, we continue to have a focus on delivering the very highest standard of education provision possible during this period.

Yr8 Options: it has been heartening to see the positive responses to the virtual options evening which went live earlier this week. Please be aware that the information page on GCSE Religious Studies has been updated to reflect a planned change in examination board. Remember, we are here to support your child so do keep lines of communication open and continue to talk about GCSE subjects with your child at home.

PD lessons Term 4: from Tuesday 23rd February, all Personal Development (PD) lessons will be delivered as live lessons through MS Teams, and students in all year groups will be invited to lessons as they are for other subjects. This will enable us to continue with our planned curriculum and ensure that sensitive subjects are delivered with teacher guidance and expertise.
