Dear Parent/Carer,

I start with a resounding vote of thanks and appreciation to our 50-strong group of hand-picked Year 9s who this week led a day of workshops for just short of 100 Year 5 children from Woodford Primary School - and what a sterling job they did too, they were fantastic ambassadors for the school and superb role models for our young visitors! Thank you also to Ms L Bennett and Ms Clapham for arranging and facilitating this project - a great Team Hele's effort all round!

Face coverings: You will have no doubt heard the Prime Minister's announcement of the removal of Plan B Covid-19 measures this week. The DfE emailed school leaders on Wednesday afternoon with the implications for schools, a summary of which is reflected below:

- Face coverings in secondary school classrooms are no longer advised as of yesterday, 20 January.
- Face coverings in secondary school *communal* areas continue to be advised until *27 January* (in line with the wider societal lifting of restrictions on that date).
- Local directors of public health are able to reverse this decision as a temporary measure in response to local health concerns.

As the DfE guidance states, "... the virus is still with us, and continuing with proportionate protective measures remains vital to protect education". This message was yesterday reiterated by Plymouth's Director of Public Health, who has advised that locally the situation regarding infection rates remains fragile and we should follow the government guidance but proceed with caution - the 0 - 15yrs age group in Plymouth is experiencing an increase in infection rates, having fallen quite significantly in December.

Given this local intelligence, it is prudent to encourage our community to continue to wear face coverings in school until we are clearer on how the local picture of infection changes, and that we all remain cautious over the coming weeks. Even though government guidance has changed, therefore, at Hele's we will continue to advise the wearing of face coverings in busy communal areas inside the building and in corridors for the next 2 weeks in the first instance. We will relax the request to wear face coverings in classrooms but will of course allow staff and students to continue to wear masks in lessons if they wish to. We will consider local infection rates on February 3rd to review this stance, and I will inform parents and carers of any recommendations we make thereafter in my weekly update on February 4th. Please be reassured that we will continue with other control measures in place in a bid to keep infection rates low in school, including sanitisation, good ventilation, and enhanced cleaning.

An important control measure remains the twice-weekly LFD testing done at home, which is expected of all staff and students. Thank you for your support in ensuring regular testing and reporting - identifying asymptomatic cases and isolating immediately reduces the number of positive cases coming into School, which in turn reduces the opportunity for the virus to spread, thus protecting the wider school community and limiting disruption to our students' education. Please keep this regular testing going, it really is making a difference!
