Dear Parent/Carer,

It has been a challenging week managing staff and student Covid-related absence, but the fantastic support and flexibility of colleagues has enabled us to keep all year groups on site and engaged in their learning. Given the Plymouth picture with high infection rates, it is worth me sharing our outbreak management plan headlines again so you are clear about the steps we take to ensure we can continue our core business function of teaching and learning in school in these uncertain times.

Specialist Supply Teachers will be brokered wherever possible to ensure continuity of education and experience of students. If no specialist cover is available, general Supply Teachers will be used. Given high demand for Supply where there is a local outbreak and a limited (even diminishing) availability of Supply via agencies, it may be necessary to adopt one of the following actions (in priority order):

- In the case of teacher absence impacting Year 12 and /or Year 13 lessons: students should be given work to complete without direct teacher supervision. Students in the affected class(es) will be expected to remain in school and complete their work in the usual classroom. Science lessons will need to be moved out of labs. The Pastoral Support Manager for Post-16 will oversee that work has been set and is being completed.
- 2. Use of the Library for up to 3 classes: supervised by a teacher with support from a Senior Leader.
- 3. In the case of significant teacher absence across the school that cannot be covered through Supply cover: students should be given work to complete independently for all their subjects and teachers of Year 12 and/or Year 13 will be deployed as emergency cover of other year groups/subjects across the school. All Year 12 and/or Year 13 students will be expected to remain in school and complete their work in the usual classroom. Science lessons will need to be moved out of labs. The Pastoral Support Manager for Post-16 will oversee that work has been set and is being completed.
- 4. In the case of significant teacher absence across the school where classes cannot be covered in spite of points 1 to 3 above: Some teaching groups will be reconfigured and larger groups (possibly half-year groups or whole year groups) will be taught in bigger spaces, such as the Main Hall or Sports Hall (subject to a risk assessment). WeST schools will be approached for any extra staffing capacity that could be directed to Hele's as a short-term measure. Alternatively, some groups with low attendance may be combined to maximise teaching staff and support staff resource available to cover.
- 5. If a risk assessment shows that it is not safe to keep students on site with reduced staffing capacity: a further conversation with WeST and the local Health Protection Team will be pursued and the need for some classes/year groups to access remote learning at home for a short period of time discussed as a last resort.

It is worth noting that we have had to enact stages 1 and 2 of our contingency plan this week. Our priority remains to keep School functioning as close to normal as possible and to ensure high-quality learning and pastoral care continues safely, whatever challenges we are faced with. Your ongoing support to ensure regular lateral flow testing and actively encouraging other control measures is appreciated.
