Staffing news: It was a pleasure this week to make some formal presentations to valued members of staff from the Hele's CCF. Pilot Officer Ramage was presented with a certificate in recognition of his recent Commissioning, Sub-Lieutenant Skingle was celebrated for successfully completing his CCF RN Section Commander's course, and Major Randall was awarded the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal, which is an honour awarded to uniformed adult volunteers who have dedicated at least 5 years' service to a cadet force. These achievements were even more poignant and special given the recent passing of Queen Elizabeth II; certificates were signed by Her Majesty and with all future awards changing to being signed by King Charles III, this really was a particularly significant accolade for our staff and a moment in history.

There was also wider celebration of the CCF with the receipt of the formal report from the biennial inspection that arrived in school at the start of term, which stated: 'This is an extremely well lead CCF with a number of high grade CFAVs (Cadet Force Adult Volunteers) whose aim is to give the cadets the best experience they can.
