Dear Parent/Carer,

'At the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month – we will remember them'. Non-Commissioned Officers and Cadets from the CCF, alongside Our Head Boy and Head Girl, led the Armistice reflections this morning in the East Quad, culminating in a Two Minute Silence at 11am across the whole school community. The short service was beamed live into every classroom so every member of the school could take part, and I am proud of the manner in which our community engaged in and respected this important act of remembrance. Additional Bank Holiday: The Government has confirmed that an extra Bank Holiday has been confirmed to mark the Coronation of King Charles III next year. It will fall on Monday 8 May 2023, two days after the Coronation will take place and is in addition to the Bank Holidays already scheduled in May (Monday 1 May and Monday 29 May). School leaders have received formal notice from the Department of Education that schools and colleges will close on this day. I will update the school calendar on the website accordingly.

Road Safety: Over recent weeks, we have had concerns raised by parents and other members of the community about students crossing Plymouth Road unsafely as they walk to and from school. The specific concerns related to students crossing to use the bus stop at the end of the day, and those visiting Tesco on the way to school. However, it is a timely reminder after the hour has changed to remind all young people of the importance of being safe on their way to and from school. We have reinforced the following points through the tutor programme but would appreciate parents reinforcing these messages at home:

- Cross at designated crossings look both ways before crossing
- Avoid looking at your mobile phone, and pay attention to the traffic and what is going on around you
- Don't run through traffic to catch the bus there will be another one along in few minutes and it is simply not worth the risk
- Be aware of vehicles and respectful of motorists and cyclists do not weave through stationary traffic
- Don't take risks

Community Links: As mentioned in previous communications, we work closely with The Rees Centre in Plympton, along with other community partners and Plympton Academy, to ensure services for young people and families living and being educated in PL7 are the best they can be. The Rees Centre houses the Wellbeing Hub for this area and undertakes much work to support local people. Attached is a poster advertising their Christmas Jumper Swap Shop which we'd strongly encourage you to get involved in if you're able. It also mentions the Light Up Plympton Christmas lights switch on scheduled for Monday, 28 November which also looks set to be a great community event - please get involved if you can.

Another wonderful upcoming community event is the Plympton Team Ministry Christmas Tree and Crib Festival, running from Saturday 10 – Sunday 11 December. This festival is part of the Advent and Christmas programme of services and events in the Ministry, and both Plympton St Mary and Plympton St Maurice churches will be opening their doors to welcome the community back to these free events. Both churches will be providing refreshments in the church halls and everyone is welcome, so please do make a note of the dates.
