Strike action: You may be aware from media coverage that the National Education Union (NEU) teaching union has declared strike action in schools. The strike is happening because of a national dispute over teacher pay between the union and the government, and not because of any issues at our school. There are 7 planned strike days throughout February and March, though strikes are regional so any individual school will only be affected by four of them. Southwest schools may be affected by strikes on: Wednesday 1 February 2023; Thursday 2 March 2023; Wednesday 15 March 2023; Thursday 16 March 2023. School leaders in the Westcountry Schools Trust are carefully planning to keep schools open wherever possible and to minimise any disruption to families. Further information will be shared with parents in due course, with a letter from Rob Haring, CEO of WeST, expected to be circulated later today.

Staffing news: Today, we say 'au revoir' to Head of MFL, Mrs Blandin-Neaves, as she leaves us for the rest of the academic year to start her maternity leave. Mrs Byrne will assume the leadership of the MFL department from now into the autumn term.

Keyham Inquest: An inquest, which could last up to 6 weeks, has opened this week into the Keyham incident which took place on 12 August, 2021 and left five people dead. The gunman then shot himself. There will be a large amount of media attention – locally and nationally – and we are conscious that this intense focus could reawaken or induce considerable anxiety and other strong emotions amongst young people and adults alike.
