The additional 6th period offers Year 11 students the opportunity to revise in optimum conditions with materials carefully designed to offer the highest-leverage improvement to their current grades. In addition, bespoke, targeted intervention also takes place during this time covering key subjects which make up the English Baccalaureate, namely English, Maths, Science, MFL and Humanities. We have been thrilled with the uptake for this provision, which was designed in response to some very strong student voice work following the Year 11 Mocks. Attendance has been over 80% each night, with students really making the most of the opportunities provided for them. I am quite sure they will reap the rewards of their hard work in August when they pick up their GCSE results! Peer Listeners: It gives me great pleasure to reward those students who go above and beyond to make our school the best place it can be for the whole community and so spending time with our Joint Leadership Group of Sixth Formers, our School Council Representatives and our newly-trained Year 12 Peer Listeners this morning at a special celebratory breakfast was an absolute joy! Well done to all those involved in this important Student Voice project; we are all looking forward to seeing the value that the newly-launched Peer Listeners programme will add to the experience of Hele's students.

Latin developments: Interest in ancient civilisations continues to grow at Hele's and we were thrilled to be able to invite Clare Holleran, author and Classics and Ancient History Professor from the University of Exeter, to share her expertise and passion with our Latin students this week. The lecture was reviewed perfectly by Year 8 student, Aaron Yates, who reported: '... we were taught about the letters of Pliny the Younger to Cornelius Tacitus, which gave eyewitness records of the event and helped better the understanding of the eruption of Vesuvius which affected many different areas. We were also taught about the phases of the eruption, which were the Plinian phase (named after Pliny the Older) and the Pyroclastic phase, which was the most destructive of the two. It was very enjoyable and we will be able to use this later in our coursework.'
