Dear Parent/Carer,

Thank you for your support and patience with the partial school closure yesterday, the second NEU strike day of 4 that are planned. We will shortly revisit our risk assessment and planning documentation to look ahead to the strikes planned for Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March and how School may be impacted. I will write to confirm provisional arrangements for these dates as soon as I can, so that families have as much notice as possible to be able to make plans.

Year 6 Transition: We are delighted to have received official confirmation this week that Hele's will be full once again at 240 pupils in Year 7 in September 2023. This will be the fifth consecutive year of being over-subscribed since we increased our pupil admission number from 210 to 240 to support strong parental choice, and it allows us the certainty to continue our plans around staffing and estates for the coming academic year.

Hele's staff have been asked to formally present to school leaders from across Plymouth next week to share 'gold standard' practice' around our transition plans. Whilst our transition and enhanced transition programmes are deemed to be strong and effective, we are always looking to improve this process in any way we can to ensure the very best start for the new Year 7s each year. If you are a parent of a Year 7 child and you have any constructive feedback to share on the experience of how your son/daughter was supported to make the move to Hele's from Primary, we'd love to hear from you. We are particularly interested in suggestions you may have to improve the lived experience for parents during this process. There are many areas of very good practice within the careers and work-related programme. These include:

• A comprehensive and well-received work-related learning programme, involving employers, planned, and delivered by the Careers Support Manager.

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- An annual 'in-house' Careers Fair, which is open to students from Year 7 13 and parents/carers, and is attended by a broad range of employers, training providers and FE/HE representatives.
- Impartial guidance, where students are made aware of the full range of post-16 and post-18 opportunities in education, training, and employment.
- Strong careers focus within the Art Department, involving visiting speakers working within the creative industries and visits to HE art departments.
- The Year 11 mock interview programme, organised by the Careers Support Manager, where students are carefully matched according to their career aspirations and interests
- A strong link with the Enterprise Adviser, who is passionate about his role in helping to develop the CEIAG programme, particularly relating to employer links.

Lots to celebrate then, but we are not resting on our laurels, and we are already planning how we can make a very good provision even better! We will continue to look at how we more explicitly connect subject classrooms with the world of work and specific career pathways and jobs, and we are also looking at ways we can secure more time to deliver impartial Information, Advice and Guidance from a trained Level 4 Advisor to a wider audience.
