Dear Parent/Carer,

I'd like to start this week by thanking you for your ongoing support around the NEU strike action. Days 3 and 4 of the planned 4-day period of action have now been completed and it seems talks between union leaders and the Government are set to begin in earnest next week. We hope this will see a resolution and avoid any further disruption but will of course keep you updated as we find out more.

This week also marked British Science Week, running from 10-19 March. Activities have taken place across the school to help raise the awareness of science in our everyday lives. Years 7 and 8 completed a bingo contest across the week by completing a range of challenges, including Library-based research, to fill in their bingo card. For students in Years 9 and 10, Paul Aldersley, oceanographer and communications specialist, presented a series of talks in Science lessons and for our Year 12s, there was the opportunity to take part in a Science careers 'speed dating' event! To round off the week, we welcome Mike Grocott (IRIS regional lead) into school this evening, to hear from a selection of Year 10 and 12 students as they present the findings of the IRIS (Institute for Research in Schools) projects they have been working on. These students will then continue work on their academic posters prior to presenting their full set of data and conclusions at Exeter University in June alongside schools across the south-west.

**WeST Curriculum Review:** On Tuesday of this week, we welcomed 7 colleagues from across the Westcountry Schools Trust into Hele's to support us with a formative review of our curriculum. A huge number of positives were drawn from the day, with colleagues commenting on the warm and friendly ethos of the school, as well as the academic rigour and challenge within our curriculum for all students, and strong engagement in lessons. Student behaviour was seen to be excellent, and alongside a strong curriculum, it was reported that students of all ages and needs have very good conditions in which to learn. Without exception, each member of the review team articulated the evidence of commitment across the school to ensuring every child at Hele's gets the best possible opportunities and care and could see the impact of our ambition to know and provide for every child playing out in all areas of school life. Whilst reporting that the review was 'wholly positive and you have a very strong base on which to build', we are not complacent and we will take forward the offered in our ambition to ensure our provision is exceptional for every young person. The key challenge is to ensure consistency within and across all areas, bringing everyone up to the standard of the very best. I am confident that our school improvement priorities for this academic year (embedding a culture of curriculum; reading with accuracy and automaticity; SEND provision; seeing the curriculum as the progression model; and mental health and wellbeing, including becoming a Trauma Informed School) and the ongoing staff development programme we have will in place to support us in getting better each day will have good impact. Thank you to those parents, students and staff who actively fed into the programme for the day.

**Online safety:** The NSPCC is running a series of FREE 1-hour online safety workshops to help parents and carers with topics such as: Gaming; Social Media; online bullying; mental health and wellbeing; parental controls, and more.
