The inspectors were genuinely impressed at how polite, kind and articulate the many students they met were over the two-day visit.

Proceedings in and beyond school didn't stop this week as a result of our visitors and it was business-as-usual with students attending the Scholar's Programme Summer School launch at Exeter University, and the Year 12 Higher Education Fair at Exeter Exhibition Centre. Our Drama students have also had a busy week as they showcased their home performance of the aptly named play, 'Tuesday' on Tuesday evening, a week before they take to the stage at Theatre Royal Plymouth to perform in front of a sell-out live audience. The feedback received from the director who visited from London to watch the performance will no doubt further improve an already fantastic show, which is part of the National Theatre Connections project. We wish our hugely talented performers the very best of luck next week.

On Wednesday evening, we celebrated our DoE students as they collected their awards in a special evening event. The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme is a wonderful part of our extra-curricular provision, with numbers of students from Year 9 upwards continuing to grow each year and an offer of bronze, silver or gold award for our students.
