Dear Parent/Carer,

Welcome back to Term 5! I hope you and your family had a restful Easter break and are looking forward to the term ahead as much as we are.

I spent the latter part of my break on a self-funded educational study visit to Nashville, Tennessee where I had the privilege of networking with system leaders from the USA and the UK and visiting a number of Charter Elementary and High Schools over the course of 6 days; a busman's holiday perhaps, but an absolutely fascinating experience and I've no doubt some of the learning I took from those visits will enhance our educational provision at Hele's and across the Westcountry Schools Trust.

Planned NEU strike action - Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May 2023: You may have seen in the news that the recent pay offer has been rejected by teaching unions. The offer, *being unfunded*, would put impossible strain on school budgets and would have a significantly detrimental impact on a school's ability to provide the highest standard of education to its students. Therefore, unions continue to pursue further negotiations with the government to see a satisfactory solution to this very difficult situation.

In the meantime, the NEU have announced two further dates of strike action so I am writing to give you notice of the impact this will have on our school ways of working during planned strike days. Our students in Year 11 and Year 13 are in the final stages of important preparations for their external examinations, therefore we are making specific plans to ensure their learning is minimally disrupted and we expect all students in these year groups to be in school; it is imperative that all students in those year groups attend to maximise their learning at such a crucial time.

A more detailed letter about arrangements for partial opening on both days will be emailed home in due course, but in short:

- Thursday 27th April Year 10, Year 11, Year 12 and Year 13 are expected to attend school. Years 7, 8 and 9 should not come to school on that day and should complete work set on ClassCharts from home.
- Tuesday 2nd May Year 11, Year 12 and Year 13 are expected to attend school. Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 should not come to school on that day and should complete work set on ClassCharts from home.

Young people who are identified as vulnerable and have attended school on previous strike days, will again attend school on these dates. The families of these young people have previously been contacted by our inclusion teams and the same arrangements as before will be in place.

I recognise that this is a significant change to our normal ways of working and I would like to again express my appreciation of your cooperation at this time.

Staffing update: We welcome 4 new staff Team Hele's this week. Fiona Donald joins the Food Technology department from Torbridge High School; Duncan Hefford joins the Maths department from Stoke Damerel Community College; Nick Bennett will cover Computer Science and ICT classes for the remainder of this academic year until our newly appointed Head of Computer Science and ICT is able to join us in September; Helen Kelly joins the Supportive Education department as a Learning Support Assistant.
