Pop-up shop for pre-loved clothing: Mrs Smith (Head of PSHE) and Mrs Wolf (Librarian), ably supported by some Year 12 students, are leading an innovative project which aims to reduce landfill and environmental impact caused by 'quick fashion' in a disposable world, as well as providing free clothing at a time when money is tight for many families. From next term, staff and students can bring 2 T-shirts to the Library to exchange for tokens to use to 'buy' 2 others, or gift them to a friend to use. Everyone is encouraged to access the swap shop - the only stipulations are that T-shirts must be clean and in good condition please, and not contain any rude or offensive language or designs! The pop-up shop will be open for business from Friday, 18 June for 4 weeks in the first instance. Theatre company performance of County Lines production: We have secured a fantastic theatre company, Alter Ego, to return to Hele's School to perform their hard-hitting piece on County Lines to raise awareness around Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE). This is an important part of our safeguarding curriculum and will be shown to Years 8-10 on Monday, 5 June. Alter Ego Creative Solutions was commissioned by Norfolk Constabulary to develop an applied theatre play to raise awareness around CCE – specifically the strand of the County Lines drug trafficking model that sees vulnerable adults and young people targeted by organised groups and gangs to groom, trick, trap and manipulate them into trafficking drugs and sometimes weapons.
