Rationale for Centre of Excellence.

The Centre of Excellence will be a **persistent advocate for students who show exceptional academic success and commitment to learning** providing a range of exciting opportunities to widen communication skills, leadership and teamwork. It will promote student self-regulation through effective planning, monitoring and evaluation of independent learning. It resolves to be passionate and relentless in fostering success, aspiration, challenge and inclusion.

The Centre of Excellence will develop students who are active enquirers and immersed in the world around them. They will have the knowledge, skills, attributes and experience to promote themselves with confidence in any context. Through exposing students to a **dynamic range of cultural and educational experiences, we aim to promote parity and social mobility.** Our work involves developing relationships with primary schools, HEI, community and parents; we are building an expanding network of educational partnerships. We benchmark our provision against the best.

The Five Pillars of Learning and over-arching aims:

Civics:

- The provision of information and learning experiences to equip and empower students to participate in democratic processes.
- To gain the ability to form their own hypotheses, create sustained and reasoned arguments and reach substantiated conclusions about citizenship issues.

Leadership:

- To possess self-awareness, credibility, a bias for action and the desire to empower others.
- To exhibit humility and stay authentic.
- To present themselves as constant and consistent role models that are fully present.

Scholarship:

- To nurture roots of education in learners and lay strong academic and intellectual foundations.
- To empower learners by ensuring they have enhanced cultural capital.

Communication:

- To be able to convey or share ideas and feelings effectively through an enhanced vocabulary.
- To be able to read, write and speak confidently with the ability to adapt to any given audience or circumstance applying ethos, pathos and logos.

Latin and Classics:

- To provide a solid foundation for the acquisition of other languages.
- To improve reading, writing, and speaking of English specifically enriching vocabulary, sharpening grammar and enhancing logic.



The Independent School Model

- It is about providing pastoral care that goes well beyond basic welfare and focuses on developing and maturing the individual

Why has you child been selected?

- based on having a SATS score in English and Maths significantly above average and a NGRT score of 120+. (The New Group Reading Test (NGRT) is a standardised, biannual assessment that reliably measures reading skills against the national average)
- Teacher recommendations and achievement points from Terms 1-2 have also been used to determine aptitude and excellent commitment to learning.

Nota Bene:

- * All of these tests are reliable but not perfect.
- * Shows ability but not commitment and dedication.
- * Work ethic is essential for future success





Aims of school for Higher Attaining students:

As a school:

Broad and balanced curriculum that is challenging and enriching.

In lesson:

- High quality teaching that teaches to the top and is aspirational in its outcomes.
- HA needs are met through intellectual, creative and physical stimulation in order to develop higher thinking skills, problem solving skills and independent study.
- HA students are able to move on more quickly to more challenging activities.
- All departments will have a policy statement for HA students that addresses provision(copy is available this evening)

Centre of Excellence A school within a school

- We want to develop students' love of learning.
- We have developed a Super Curriculum which provides students with a range of suggested activities that take their regular curriculum *further*.
- These activities can take many forms including reading, watching videos online, downloading podcasts, attending lectures, visiting museums or entering academic competitions.




LATIN
