Dear Parents and Carers,

Fit & Fed: Plymouth City Council has received funding from the Department for Education to coordinate the Fit & Fed programme within Plymouth. Holiday times can be pressure points for parents, with extra costs and limited opportunities to work. Fit & Fed aims to help relieve these issues with funded Holiday Club places for eligible children and young people:

- Children who receive benefit related free school meals
- Children with an EHCP
- Looked After Children
- Children from refugee or asylum seeking families, or Ukrainian families
- Children with a Child Protection Plan
