Welcome to the booklet for 'Enrichment Week' 2024! During these 5 days the normal school timetable will be suspended and replaced by a fabulous menu of activities to suit all interests, giving all young people the chance to try new things or improve their skills and knowledge in existing hobbies or interests and to work with other young people across the age range.

There are opportunities for sports, outdoor and adventure activities, creative and arts-based activities, science, technology and nature experiences; we have tried hard to cater for all interests and budgets and we are convinced that there will definitely be something in this booklet to light every young person's fire!

Choosing an Activity

Please read through all the activity details in this booklet. Some activities may require early-morning departures or may return to school later than usual, and some activities may require students to meet at an alternative location, e.g. Golf. It is important that young people can make their own way safely to and from the venues at these times should they wish to pick these activities.

Places will not be allocated on a first-come first served basis, although we will look at when applications are received where activities are over-subscribed. We will endeavour to meet the requests of as many students as possible **across their 3 choices**. Please do not rush into a decision but read all the information carefully before submitting your choices.

Application process: Students should choose three activities in order of preference and complete the online application form sent to all parents on 6th December 2023. Using this system, all applications will automatically be date and time stamped and no paperwork can then go astray. The deadline for all applications is **8am Monday 11th December**.

Confirmation of a place on an activity will be given as soon as all lists of participants have been agreed. We anticipate that this will be some time early in Term 3 and will appear on your ParentPay account as confirmation that your child has been allocated to an activity. Once your choice has been confirmed you will NOT be able to swap to another activity without consent, so choose wisely!

Whilst we will do everything we can to satisfy first choices, this may not always be possible, there are over 700 students making choices and most of the activities have a maximum number of participants. Likewise, if there are insufficient numbers opting for an activity then regrettably the activity may need to be cancelled and the student offered an alternative. Conduct and Behaviour

We expect students to maintain their high standard of conduct and behaviour during Enrichment Week. We welcome applications for all activities from all students, but in exceptional circumstances it may be that a young person is refused a place on the grounds of previous, poor or dangerous behaviour. We take our safeguarding duties seriously and are not willing to jeopardise the enjoyment or safety of any child on any activity. Alternative on-site provision would be made for any student who is felt to pose too much of a risk to take part in particular activities. Likewise, instances of poor or dangerous behaviour during an activity may result in a child being removed from an activity. If this is the case, a refund will not be possible and parents/carers may be instructed to collect them from where the activity is taking place.

Attendance

Please note that Enrichment Week is an integral part of your child's education. Attendance is **NOT** optional; it is part of our school term and it is important that normal attendance is maintained. Any absence not supported by an acceptable reason (e.g. illness or medical appointment) will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Other Information

If a student is in receipt of a free school meal (FSM) then these will be ordered in advance for them. Otherwise, meals can be purchased from the school canteen as normal for school-based activities. Off-site activities will require a packed lunch to be provided or money to purchase refreshments where appropriate.

We know that Enrichment Week will be a fun, action-packed and deep learning experience for all involved; we can't wait! I hope that you share our enthusiasm as you read through this booklet and see the opportunities on offer to our young people. Our intention is to make this an awesome week so that it continues to be a central part of the Hele's School experience each year!

Enrichment Week has the following key learning objectives:

- ♦ To provide our learners with a valuable social and educational experience (not usually available within the traditional school day) during which they can:
 - develop self confidence and self esteem;
 - improve their motivation to learn new and challenging skills;
 - enhance their communication skills;
 - learn and develop team working skills;
 - become resourceful and resilient;
 - accept and take on increasing levels of responsibility;
 - change/develop attitudes and values and respect the value of differences between people.
- To provide an inclusive programme of learning which meets all budgets and interests.
- To provide a programme which gives learners opportunities to gain national qualifications and certificates, wherever appropriate.
- ◆ To provide opportunities for learners to experience success and to celebrate their achievements.
- ♦ To develop trust and whole school team spirit throughout the week developing, improving and strengthening relationships between learners, staff and the community.
- To provide learners with opportunities to complete active citizenship projects.
- To engage learners in fun and active reviews, where they reflect and think about what they have learned about themselves and others from these experiences, how they could benefit



Payment for Activities

The cost for each activity is shown at the bottom of each page, along with arrangements for payment. Some costs are approximate and will usually depend upon the final numbers opting for each activity, although the amount shown in the booklet will be the maximum amount you can expect to pay. Arrangements have been made to try to subsidise activities wherever possible to keep costs manageable.

Payments cannot be made until places have been confirmed by letter and will then appear on your ParentPay account. Once you have received confirmation of your child's place on an activity, you will be asked to pay either the amount in full or to pay the first instalment. Please refer to the individual activity outlines for payment requirements. Payment will act as a **non-refundable** and **non-transferable** deposit, so please make choices carefully! (Note: the only exceptions to this rule are if the school has to cancel an activity due to insufficient numbers opting to do it or if an activity is cancelled by the provider (e.g. due to Covid). In such circumstances the deposit will be refunded in full.)

Deposits will be required by **31st January 2024**. All payments must be completed by **Monday 29th April 2024** for a student to participate in their chosen activity. No changes to activities will be allowed after this date unless agreed by the Finance Department.

All payments should be made via the **ParentPay** link. This gives the flexibility to make payments whenever you choose, as well as eradicating the risk of your child 'misplacing' your hard earned cash or cheques on their way to school! ParentPay can be accessed via the school website:

If you do not have access to the internet and ParentPay, you can request a **BARCODE** letter which will link to the activity your child is assigned to.

If students are taking part in an activity that involves long journeys or specialist activities, you may be invited to an information evening nearer the time. This will give you a chance to meet staff members and find out more about the activity.


Animal Antics

Day 3: Explore 2- Climbing at Hound Tor



Rocking Romans



New for 2024

A week having fun with various Roman based activities and more!

We will be going to London to visit the British Museum and look at their fine collection of Roman artefacts. They range from stone and metal sculptures of emperors and gods to jewellery, silverware, pottery, and glass, including the famous cameo glass Portland Vase.

In the afternoon, we will get a bird's eye view form the London Eye to see many famous landmarks. This will be followed by a river boat cruise down the Thames.

The week will also include a walking tour around Exeter with a Roman Centurian who will provide you with lots of local Roman information.

Isca (Exeter) will reveal its Roman influence! There will be a visit to the Exeter Museum and some free time in the afternoon to see the cathedral and shops.

We will go to Ocean studios in the Royal William Yard and spend the day making a vessel in terracotta clay using slabs. These will be decorated using both black and white slip and be enhanced by a method called sgraffito. Students will also make unique patterns that reflects Roman ideologies. These patterns will be used to develop designs onto a T-shirt using block printing which is a typical form of print in the Roman times!

There will also be two days of Roman arts and crafts in school involving mosaic picture making and the building of a colosseum!
