## A REVISION MENU FOR STUDENTS

<b>Independently</b>	
<b>IMPROVE YOUR MOCKS</b>	<b>CREATE A QUOTATION TIMELINE</b>
Green pen your mocks and <u>after, make flashcards of how you've improved each question</u>	Consider the events of the texts and reduce them to a single quotation per event. Which quotes are going to be useful to learn?
<b>COMPLETE QUIZZES ONLINE</b>	<b>USE A PRACTICE QUESTION</b>
Use Seneca, Doodle, Sparknotes etc. to complete quizzes. <u>Note down any answers you did not get right.</u>	Plan your response to a practice question and only write your introduction. <u>Make sure your plans have quotations, context and themes on it.</u>
<b>CREATE POSTERS OR FLASCHARDS</b>	<b>CREATE INSTRUCTIONS</b>
Create flashcards with questions on one side and answers on the other. Don't forget to add language analysis for any quotations.	Create an instruction booklet about how to approach a certain question. Check this with your teacher after.
<b>CREATE YOUR OWN EXAM PAPER</b> (with mark scheme?)	<b>REREAD/WATCH THE TEXTS!</b>
Check this with your teacher to see if you've understood the demands of your exam paper!	Reread the texts or watch the play of Macbeth. <u>As you read/watch, write down key quotes or any gaps in your knowledge. DO NOT DO THIS IN ONE SESSION.</u> Spread this over a few weeks.
<b>In pairs/ groups</b>	
<b>QUIZ EACH OTHER</b>	<b>30 SECOND CHALLENGE</b>
Write down 10 challenging questions and answers to ask your partner. Quiz each other and check their knowledge.	Talk for 30 seconds about your topic. Your partner will ask you three questions at the end of it about something you've said or to discuss things further.
<b>TEACH SOMEONE ELSE (anyone!)</b>	<b>MEMORY DUMP</b>
Teach and demonstrate how to answer a question. Any questions they may ask you during the process will help your understanding of the question	Choose one of your topics. Independently mind map for 5 -10 minutes about that topic. Compare notes afterwards and add things you've missed in another colour pen.
