Dear Parent/Carer,

It is with mixed emotions that I write my final communication to you as an academic year like no other comes to an end today. Reflecting on this year, it is quite incredible that the significant challenges we faced and overcame back in the autumn term when we experienced a significant cyber-attack on our IT network have all but paled into insignificance in the light of a coronavirus global pandemic – yes, the '19-'20 academic year has certainly tested our mettle in all manner of ways and I, as I've no doubt many of you will, shall be glad to draw it to a close!

I am immensely proud of our community for the manner in which we have navigated the storm of the past 20 weeks, in particular, for how we have pulled together and tackled head on the challenges that very few, if any, of us had ever considered possible. Whilst we have been unable to gather as a staff body to pass on our thanks in person and give colleagues the Team Hele's sendoff we usually do, our love and best wishes follow each of them into the next chapter of their life and we thank them for their tremendous support of students, families and staff throughout their time with us.

**GCSE and A Level results:** a letter was sent to all Year 11 and Year 13 students yesterday, and also to their parents/carers, from Ms Clapham, Assistant Principal. This contains important information about the arrangements for distributing the summer exam results and I would urge you to read this and ensure you fully understand the process for our students this summer. We wish the Class of 2020 the very best of luck for results day and for their next steps. We are so proud of the manner in which our Leavers have conducted themselves throughout a time of such turmoil, uncertainty and disappointment, and I repeat my pledge that we will ensure that every child has support to access an appropriate progression route after receiving their results. Ms Clapham's letter contains further details of this support on offer.

**Summer food support:** eligible families (including those with children in Year 11) should readily receive their food vouchers for the summer from Edenred, but should there be any questions then please contact Mrs Hamblin at <u>hamblinc@heles.plymouth.sch.uk</u> and she will endeavour to help you. Alongside this support, is the continuation of the fully inclusive Plympton Team Ministry Community Foodbank, which remains open and available to all households in need of food in Plympton over the summer break and into the future. All emails and referrals are dealt with in the strictest of confidence.

**Road safety:** as part of the Council's road safety programme, new signs will be installed on Larkham Lane by the end of August. There will be an advisory speed limit of 20 mph when lights flash, with the times coinciding with the start and end of the school day. This will help to improve road safety in the vicinity and the Council hope this will encourage more journeys to be made to school on foot and by bicycle. The Council will be monitoring traffic speeds in the area in the autumn term to assess the effectiveness of the system in reducing traffic speeds. The weekly updates I have written since March will cease today and I will ceremoniously archive the communications on our School website and remove the 'COVID-19' alert banner as we move into a new beginning after the summer. I will write again in September to welcome everyone to the new academic year and to introduce the twelve new teaching and support staff we have joining Team Hele's, but in the meantime I wish you and your family a restful summer, with plenty of time for relaxation and recovery after what has been a truly unforgettable school year.
