I'm delighted that staff have settled into the new routine of remote learning, in spite of all the challenges that presents. I do hope you will be able to engage with our new colleagues sooner rather than later, even if that is through virtual Parents' Evenings throughout this term.

Remote Learning: please note that we are not delivering live lessons in Active Lifestyles (Core PE), Personal Development (PD), KS4 Core RS (Philosophy and Ethics) and Forensic Reading. Instead, work for these subjects is available at a glance on one sheet, on our website (School Information, Remote Learning), and on the Year Team Curriculum General channel post. Students will be given information about how to submit this work so that achievement points can be issued.

Teacher Absence: if a teacher is absent from work because they are ill, they will be unable to deliver live lessons. In this case, students will receive an email outlining where to find the work to complete independently or directing them to an appropriate Oak National Academy lesson. Parents/carers will also receive a message via In-Touch.

MS Assignments: we are increasingly using Microsoft Assignments during lessons because this enables teachers to check understanding and engagement. If your child is having any difficulties with finding or submitting assignments, they should watch these short videos as a quick refresher:

How to access an assignment set by your teachers

How to hand in your assignments

How to see the feedback from your teachers

Please note that not all assignments will be individually marked, but they will be used by teachers to check understanding, provide whole-class feedback, address common misconceptions and plan future lessons. Individual written feedback will continue in line with departmental policies.

Supporting home learning routines: the Education Endowment Fund (EEF) have produced a checklist to support good routines and planning the day during remote learning periods. The graphic here shows the template and it is on the school website for parents and students to download should you find it useful. The EEF have also made a short video (2 minutes) to help parents and carers discuss getting organised and maximising remote learning time - this can be found here.

Ofqual consultation: you may have picked up through the press that teacher assessment in a yet-to-be-defined form will be used in place of the cancelled summer exams to determine final GCSE and A Level grades, as well as vocational outcomes. A consultation is about to launch nationally and is intended to run for 2 weeks. Whilst there is much to consider and agree, there are early indicators that there could be some form of shorter, externally set and internally marked assessment in subjects and that young people will be 'assessed on what they have learnt, rather than against the content they have not had a chance to study.' It is



crucial, then, that students remain motivated, focused and work as hard as possible throughout the months ahead. We will continue to keep families of students in Years 11 and 13 updated on developments via email in the usual manner.

Free School Meals (FSM): the government have reinstated the national voucher scheme for those families in receipt of FSM and will once again use Edenred to distribute these electronically. We anticipate a smooth transition fro our current system, but do please contact Carolyn Hamblin at hamblinc@heles.plymouth.sch.uk should you experience an issue with the changeover from next week.
