Dear Parent/Carer,

You will no doubt have seen this week that the Prime Minister announced that it will not be possible to resume faceto-face learning immediately after the February half-term, and Monday 8 March is the earliest date cited for a possible return of some/all children. There is much that remains uncertain, however, so we need to continue to plan together and provide as best we can in the interim.

Virtual School survey: we have received a large number of "thank-you" emails from parents/carers in recent weeks, and this has meant a great deal to us, but we are also keen to improve our virtual school further. We would really appreciate it if you could take a few minutes to answer the 5 very brief questions on this survey. We will use parent, student and staff feedback to refine our provision further after half-term, so your voice really will make a difference.

Virtual classrooms: thank you for your support over recent weeks; we know that this a challenging time for parents/carers but you really are doing a great job by giving your child(ren) a quiet place to work, reducing distractions and providing the encouragement they need. That said, please do remain hyper-vigilant about background noise when children are in their virtual classrooms. I really do understand that many households are incredibly busy with several activities underway during this lockdown and we are all doing our best to juggle these demands, but please be mindful that a few lessons this week have been interrupted by some rather choice language from adults in the background that was clearly not intended to be heard by a classroom full of children! Your support in this matter really is appreciated.

Also, a polite but strong reminder that parents/carers or other family members are not to join the lesson or ask to speak to the teacher under any circumstances please; I would neither expect nor tolerate a parent/carer walking into a classroom to address a teacher or comment on the learning in 'normal' times, and there remains a clear line in the sand for virtual classrooms. We have systems in place for dealing with any queries or concerns and those systems remain firmly in place throughout the remote learning period. Please contact the school in the normal way (phone call or email) and we will gladly direct your enquiry to the appropriate person to deal with any concerns you have in a timely and constructive way.

Virtual Parents' Evenings: we have been encouraged by the success of this week's inaugural virtual Parents' Evening for Post-16, and plans are well underway for the Year 11 Subject Evening next week, 3rd February. Year 8 KS4 Options process: students will have an assembly in tutor time next Friday 5th Feb to launch the KS4 Options Process, and the Virtual Options Evening will take place online on Tuesday 9th February for all Y8 students, parents and carers. Further details to follow next week!

Virtual Careers Fair: this exciting resource will be made available for parents, carers and students to access from 4.00pm on Tuesday 2nd February, remaining on our website throughout the year. It will be a valuable addition to our Careers Education Information and Guidance resources. End of term and WeST training day: term 3 ends on Friday 12th February at 3pm and term 4 begins for all children on Tuesday 23rd February. There is a calendared Trust-wide remote staff training day on Monday 22nd February, and hence there will be no remote provision on this day.

Children's mental health: Heads of Year are promoting activities throughout the whole of next week that will support wellbeing for body, mind and emotions. In the meantime, a couple of good resources to point you to:

UCAS connects people to University, apprenticeships & internships and is an important part of the Year 13 calendar. Today is the deadline for September applications, and I am delighted to hear that 67 applications have been submitted – last year at this stage, 47 Year 13s had applied through UCAS. This impressive figure demonstrates the resilience of our wonderful young people and how they remain future-focused and planning their next steps, in spite of being in the midst of a global pandemic. Thank you to Mrs Earnshaw for coordinating the UCAS process and the whole Post-16 Pastoral team for their support of our Year 13s. Best of luck to all those submitting applications!

At the other end of school, it was an absolute pleasure to phone Emma Beasley of 7G yesterday (and a very proud Mrs Beasley, of course) to pass on my heartfelt congratulations for being the first to achieve the Diamond Award for Achievement Points this academic year. Emma currently has 220 positive points on ClassCharts (and no negatives), smashing the benchmark of 200 to achieve the highest accolade, and with 5 months still left of this academic year! A phenomenal effort - well done, Emma, and keep up the great work!
